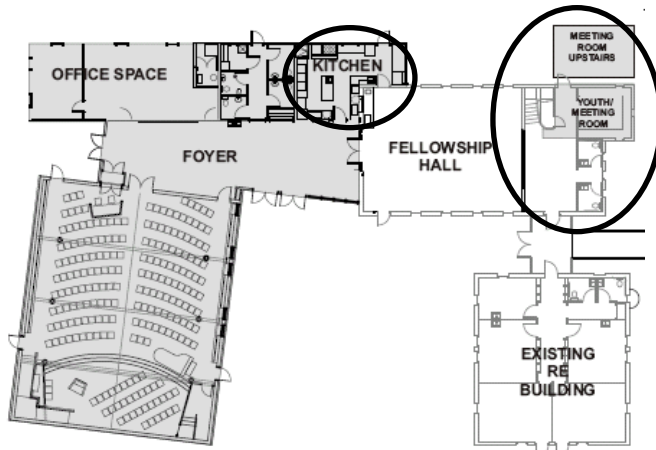




Join the **QUUF TUFO Campaign** aka The Targeted **Unfunded Objects** of our Desire Campaign

After years of planning, fundraising, and much hard work, Quimper Unitarian Universalist Fellowship has a beautiful new sanctuary and other new spaces to enjoy now and into the future. It was accomplished with over \$950,000 in donations from 245 families over the last four years.

BUT, as you know, the building project is not quite done. We would like to finish the “Complete” plan authorized by our Congregational vote in 2008:



“COMPLETE” Building Option (Approved by QUUF in June, 2008)

- ✓ New Sanctuary
- ✓ New Foyer
- ✓ New Bathrooms
- ✓ New Office Space
- ✗ New Kitchen, serving both new & existing spaces
- ✓ Additional Parking Lot
- ✗ Renovation of rear of existing sanctuary for new Youth meeting space (downstairs) and RE/ALPs meeting room (upstairs)

We simply ran out of funds before we could finish two major items: the new kitchen and the renovation of the former Sanctuary, kitchen, and office spaces.

Two task forces have developed plans for:

- The “Opening Sunday Kitchen Project” – completion of Phase I of our new kitchen, which we hope to complete by September 12, 2010
- The “Fellowship Hall Renovation Project” – alterations to the Fellowship Hall, upstairs meeting spaces, and old kitchen space, which we hope to complete in December, 2010

Both of these projects require new donations and volunteer labor. Your help is needed.

Here’s the Timetable

May 23: Announcement of fundraising campaign; brochure available

Friday, May 28: Wine & Cheese Party Kick off. You are all invited to come socialize, learn more about the projects, and ask questions, 5-6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall

June 6 and 13: Accept donations of \$ and volunteer labor at/after services

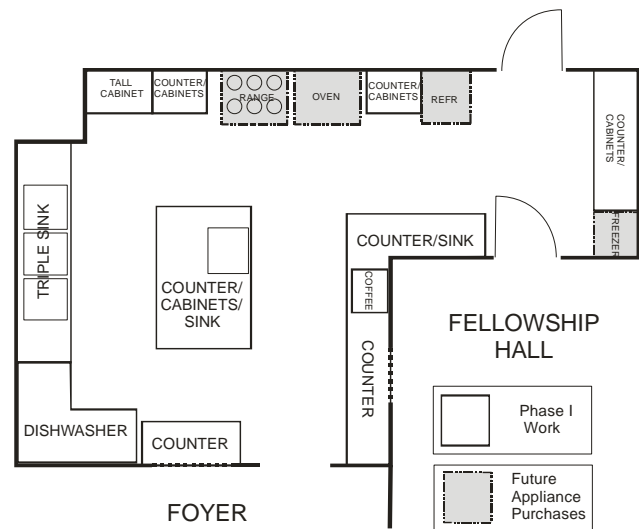
June – Aug: Build cabinets, install new equipment, relocate existing range and refrigerator

Sept 12: New kitchen in use for first time!

Sept – Dec: Renovate and reconfigure back of Fellowship hall, old kitchen & office spaces

The Opening Sunday Kitchen Project (Phase I of our new QUUF Kitchen) includes:

- Institutional-style dishwasher, triple sink, and surrounding stainless steel counters
- Installation of new (already purchased) coffee maker system
- Counters and cabinetry for coffee/tea making area, hand washing sink, and food prep area
- New cabinets to store all of our dishes, glassware, & all other kitchen items
- Relocation of existing range, microwave, and refrigerator from old kitchen to the new kitchen (for temporary use, until further funds are available for replacement)



By completing this project, we will be able to:

- Serve coffee/tea more efficiently on Sundays and at events in the Foyer/Fellowship Hall
- More effectively host our own events, such as the Auction and Stewardship Dinner
- Offer a better rental experience
- Clean up after events faster & easier
- Use the two pass-through windows to the Fellowship Hall and Foyer
- Vacate the old kitchen space and make way for the Fellowship Hall Renovation Project

Total cost of Phase I Kitchen: \$31,000
 Funds currently available: \$12,800
Funds needed to be raised: \$18,200



Project elements include:

- High-volume, high-temperature dishwasher (1 minute wash!)
- Dishwasher exhaust vent system
- Stainless steel triple sink and counters (that surround dishwasher and triple sink)
- Sinks for dish rinsing, hand washing, and food prep
- Completion of Fellowship Hall pass-through window
- Coffee prep counter area (with new coffee system installed)
- Other kitchen storage cabinets and countertops

Besides the additional \$ we need to raise, how will this work get done?

- Professional installation of dishwashing system
- Jerry Spieckerman will lead cabinet construction and installation crew
- Volunteers needed to assist with cabinet installation and misc. tasks

When will the volunteer work be done?

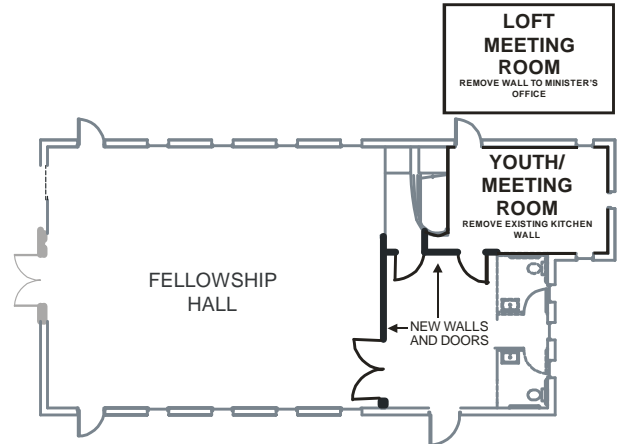
- June, July, and August 2010

The Fellowship Hall Renovation Project includes:

- Construction of a wall (with a double door) across the back of the Fellowship Hall
- Gutting the old kitchen and converting it to a meeting space for our Youth and others
- Taking out a wall in the Loft to create a larger meeting space (for RE/ALPs)

With the completion of this project, we will be able to:

- Use the Fellowship Hall as a separate space for QUUF and for rentals, with doors at both ends
- Enjoy a new classroom/meeting space for our Youth group and other small gatherings
- Better utilize the Loft space for RE, ALPS, and rental groups
- Have a vestibule with doors into Fellowship Hall, Loft, new meeting space, & bathrooms

Project elements include:

- New wall at back of Fellowship Hall with double door entry from 24th Street vestibule area
- Removal of wall in Loft between minister's old office and main room, electrical work, new carpeting (including stairs), and paint
- Gutting of old kitchen, removal of door/pass thru wall, construction of new wall with doors to new meeting space and Loft, electrical work, carpeting, paint, etc.

Besides the additional \$ we need to raise, how will this work get done?

- Professional management of project by licensed contractor
- Electrical, plumbing, and other work done by licensed sub-contractors
- Volunteers needed to assist with demolition and selected construction tasks

When will this work be done?

- September through December 2010

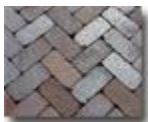
Fellowship Hall & Sanctuary:

Hand trucks for moving Sanctuary chairs



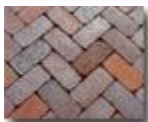
Foyer:
